

## Sports Premium at Parkwood

## **Vision**

ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

## Aim

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

Schools must use the Sports Premium Funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and Sport offered. This means that the premium should be used to:

- -develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- -build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity- the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes pf physical activity a day, of which 30 should be in school
- 2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport

The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. During the academic year 2021-2022, Parkwood Academy will receive £17,690.

We plan to spend our funding on the following areas;

Get Set 4 PE Scheme	A sequenced scheme with clear knowledge and progression from EYFS to Year 6.	£500	Quality of PE unit sequencing and teaching will increase. All children's knowledge of games and other PE units and vocabulary they use will increase as a result of this.
Sports coaches	3 coaches to upskill teaching staff and to provide free lunchtime and after school clubs for Nursery-Year 6.	£7100	More children will participate in extra-curricular clubs and will be exposed to a range of sports disciplines.  All children will have access to high quality extracurricular provision, run by qualified coaches for free.  Target groups will participate in physical activity at lunch or after school.
Chelmsford Schools Sports Partnership	Membership to the Chelmsford Schools Sports Partnership.	£600	Number of children participating in Level 2 competitions will increase. Access to a range of specialist equipment.
Sports MDA/LSA	An MDA to run lunchtime clubs every day. An LSA to work with SEND and disadvantaged children on sports activities daily.	£4000	Children will develop resilience and learn how to work as a team through various sports activities. Children will have an increased awareness of sportsmanship and demonstrate this through the games run.
